Monthly Meetings

Our monthly meetings are held at the Salem Hall, Main Street, Burley in Wharfedale, LS29 7DG. Please ensure you check the individual meeting times for the event in question. We start with refreshments and a chat at the times indicated below, and the welcome and main item begin half an hour later.

Sunday 14th January 2024, 3-5pm - East Germany (The DDR)

James Todd will examine the questions, "What was it actually like to live in East Germany? Who controlled the country? What was the role of the Stasi?" The talk will be in English and will conclude with an examination of Ostalgia, a wistful longing for a disappeared country which is surprisingly prevalent in the minds of many former East Germans.

Sunday 18th February 2024, 3-5pm – The Anders Family

Eddie Lawler will give a talk on the Anders family. This will be based on an exchange of letters (and parcels) between a German and an English mother immediately after the 2nd World War, revealing some key aspects of German history. And what happened next? The talk will be in German with English summaries.

Sunday 17th March 2024, 7.30-9.30pm - Das Phänomen Bruno Gröning (1906-1959)

Scarborough German Society member and regular participant in Kaffee und Kuchen, Mick Ganley will talk about the mystic and healer, Bruno Gröning. The talk hopes to examine his legacy, which is still questioned today, and attempt to place this controversial figure in some sort of historical context. The talk will be in English with some documents in German.

Sunday 14th April 2024, 7.30-9.30pm – Annual General Meeting followed by a talk by Marion Lawson about her mother who came from Germany.

Other activities.

Kaffee und Kuchen: These conversation sessions, held on **Zoom**, are open to all members and their friends who would like to practise speaking German. The first half of each session is for general conversation and news, and during the second half a specific topic (e.g., a holiday in Germany, a current issue, a favourite book or film etc.) is considered. Participants are split into smaller groups as and when appropriate. Kaffee und Kuchen takes place twice a month on Friday afternoons from 4.00 until 5.30 pm. The next sessions will be on the 19th January, 2nd and 16th February.

Beginners' German lessons: The ninth series of 8 weekly lessons on **Zoom** will start in March. They take place on Thursdays from 5.30 to 6.30 pm and are free to all existing and new members. We are also willing to run a few **advanced sessions** at times to be arranged with participants. Contact Peter if you're interested in either of the above.

Student events: These events are organised by the WGC alone or in conjunction with the Foreign Language Assistants Committee at Leeds University.
