Sunday 17th July 2022 - Wilhelm Busch

Leeds Anglo German Club member Lieselotte Humphreys will entertain us with a talk about this North German poet, humorist, painter and author, most famous for his verse story of Max und Moritz, which he illustrated himself.

The talk will be in German with English summaries

Future meetings: 14th August; 18th September - "My place in Germany"; 16th October; 13th November; 11th December - Weihnachtsfeier (Christmas party).

Kaffee und Kuchen: These conversation sessions, held on ZOOM, are open to all members and their friends who would like to practise speaking German. The first half of each session is for general conversation and news, and during the second half a specific topic (eg a holiday in Germany, memories of schooldays, a favourite museum or gallery etc.) is considered. Participants are split into smaller groups as and when appropriate. Kaffee und Kuchen takes place twice a month on Friday afternoons from 3.30 until 5pm.

Beginners' German lessons: The third series of these 8 weekly lessons on ZOOM is scheduled to begin in May. They will take place on Thursdays at 5.30 pm, last an hour and will be free to all existing and new members!!

A few advanced sessions will also be held at times to be arranged with those interested. Contact Peter if you'd like to take part in either of the above.

Student events: We are once again able to offer student events in person and are helping foreign-language assistants (FLAs) of all nationalities to get to know Yorkshire and beyond. Forthcoming events planned either solely by the WGC or in conjunction with the FLA committee at Leeds University are a visit to Halifax, including the Piece Hall, the Minster and an Indian restaurant (2nd March), a coach trip to Whitby and Robin Hood's Bay, including a treasure trail, fish and chips, a cliff walk, and a cream tea (26th March), a walk along the Leeds and Liverpool Canal from Crossflatts to Saltaire (9th March) and a baking day and Ilkley Moor walk (19th March). New Zoom meetings for WGC members and our German contacts: We have made good progress in our quest to strengthen and re-establish links between the WGC and our contacts in Germany. Our idea was to find at least ten WGC members and German contacts (20 in all) and to set up Zoom meetings about 4 or 5 times per year to discuss items of interest - perhaps current affairs or press articles in each other's countries, but not restricted to that. We now have enough people to begin our initiative (thanks to all of you who have volunteered!), but still need to sort out suitable dates and times. As quite a few of those interested work full time, the meetings would have to be in the early evening, UK time, to allow for time being an hour later in Germany. We are aiming for the first meeting to be in mid-March.

We feel that discussion should take place in English or German, whichever the participants feel most comfortable with (but certainly a mixture of the two languages). We would probably follow the format we use for Kaffee und Kuchen, where we have some whole-group discussion and then smaller break-out groups of 4 or 5 people. If you have not yet contacted Marilyn about this, but feel you'd like to take part, please get in touch with her as soon as possible.

Jacquie Briggs, a valued and longstanding member of the WGC, sadly died in early January. A former schoolteacher, Jacquie pursued languages in her retirement, achieving the Institute of Linguists Final Diploma and a degree in German, as well as picking up Spanish! This was in part because one of her sons lived in Germany and another lives in the Canary Islands, but also because she had a lively and enquiring mind. Jacquie's European credentials were beyond question; she won the quiz at our WGC Euro-party in January 2000, and when a group of our friends from the Minden Anglo-German Society visited us in 2008 to help us celebrate the WGC's 20th Anniversary, Jacquie was delighted to host their secretary and his two children. She was also amazingly fit, physically, well into old age; she seemed indefatigable on our WGC group trip to Munich in 2018, walking miles to see the sights. There, she particularly enjoyed seeking out the paintings of Caspar David Friedrich in the art gallery we visited. And we can all recall the amusing talk she gave us after our AGM in 2019, when, in her excellent German, she told us about a family trip to Disneyland Paris. She also joined us on Zoom during lockdown, with her son Richard. We shall all really miss Jacquie.
